STATE VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT DRAW

The draw for the 23rd KHSAA State Volleyball Tournament has been conducted. The State Volleyball Tournament will be played Oct. 26-27 at Ryle High School and Gray Middle School in Union. This marks the fourth consecutive year for Ryle and Gray to host the event and sixth time in the last eight years.

The Volleyball postseason gets underway with District Tournaments slated for Oct. 8-13 and Regional Tournaments scheduled for Oct. 15-20. Six-time defending State Champion Assumption will go for its seventh consecutive title as the Rockets have claimed volleyball's top spot eight of the last nine years.

Six-time defending State Champion Assumption continues its volleyball dominance. The Rockets improved to 26-0 on the year after picking up top honors at the Nike Challenge over the weekend. Assumption scored wins over St. Michael's (TX) 15-2, 15-7, Stagg (IL) 15-5, 15-5, Downers Grove (IL) 15-8, 15-4, Divine Savior (IL) 15-4, 15-7 and McAuley (IL) 15-13, 3-15, 16-14. Assumption gets back in to action with a contest at Notre Dame Tuesday before hosting Mercy on Thursday.

LAWRENCE COUNTY'S WEST ON THE LOOSE

Lawrence County's Michael West moved to fifth among career rushing leaders with 155 yards on 29 carries in the Bulldogs' 51-7 win over Rowan County. West now has 6,847 career rushing yards, 1,377 shy of Derek Homer's state-record 8,224 yards.

Bardstown's Jon Monin completed 10 of 13 passes for 224 yards and three touchdowns in the Tigers' 55-6 win over Shawnee. **Josheph Blackmon** had four receptions for 72 yards and a touchdown and returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown. **Maurice Crowe** had four receptions for 106 yards and two touchdowns. On the year, Monin has completed 60 of 83 attempts for 1,256 yards and 18 touchdowns.

Marcus Wright of Eminence ran 17 times for 200 yards and two touchdowns in a 30-6 win over Yellow Springs (OH). Wright also had two interceptions, eight tackles and completed five of nine pass attempts for 61 yards and two touchdowns.

Jared Wagner completed nine of 14 passes for 215 yards and five touchdowns – all in the first half – in helping Fleming County post a 56-14 win over Lewis County. **Jon Hickerson** blocked a punt and returned an interception 52 yards for a touchdown.

Harlan's Jamie Jacobs ran 27 times for 264 yards and three touchdowns in a 50-41 loss to Cumberland. Jacobs also had a 28-yard field goal in the contest. On the year, he has ran for 200-plus-yards in four games.

Holy Cross (Louisville) racked up 513 total offensive yards in a 40-0 win over Trimble County. Eric Moore led the squad with 132 yards and four touchdowns on 24 rushing attempts. **Nick Nail** completed eight of 11 passes for 194 yards and a touchdown. **Jeff Wachtel** ran for 103 yards and a touchdown and had three receptions for 85 yards.

Defending Class AAAA State Champion **Male** compiled 467 yards of offense in a 72-7 win over Southern. **Mike Bush** had five receptions for 178 yards and two touchdowns while **Sergio Spencer** ran for 64 yards and a touchdown. Spencer also had three receptions for 39 yards and two touchdowns. **Steven Garr** added three receptions for 35 yards and two touchdowns. **Bryant Beck** returned a fumble recovery 51 yards for a touchdown and **Corey James** returned an interception 56 yards for a touchdown.

Middlesboro's Durrell White has ran 39 times for 675 yards over the last three games for the Yellowjackets.

Monroe County's Casey Kirk returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown – a school record – in a 47-15 win over Butler County. Tyler Witty now holds the school record for career PATs with 38.

Owensboro Catholic's Kyle McGraw has set a school record for pass completions with 93 through six games. The old mark was 85, set by Kenny Flashpoehler in 1972.

Paris quarterback **Odell Cosby** enjoyed a school-record night passing in a 26-23 win over Raceland. Cosby completed 14 of 21 passes for 298 yards in the contest for the Hounds.

Paul Dunbar's Corey Dunn remains just 169 yards shy of the school single-single rushing record after an open date last week. Dunn trails Mikal Smith's mark set in 1992. Dunn already owns the career school rushing record with 2,818 yards, surpassing Ben Meighan's mark of 2,509 set from 1994-97.

Harrison County's Devon Dotson had three receptions for 36 yards and a touchdown in a 49-6 win over Western Hills. Dotson's third reception was his 75th career, moving him into first place among the school's all-time leaders. Joe Daniel (1996-98) previously held the mark with 74 career touchdown receptions. Dotson was also named Homecoming King.
