COMMONWEALTH GRIDIRON BOWL RETURNS TO BOWLING GREEN

For the second consecutive year six new state champions will be crowned at the KHSAA Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl at Houchens-L.T. Smith Stadium on the campus of Western Kentucky University. Three games will be contested on Friday, Dec. 3 and Saturday, Dec. 4.

Two defending champions are making a trip to the Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl this year (Boyle County and Highlands) while a total of four undefeated teams (Mayfield, Hazard, Allen County-Scottsville and Boyle County) will be trying to take home a championship.

STATE FOOTBALL TICKETS

Single Session general admission tickets are on sale at any of the 12 participating schools for an advance purchase price of \$8 each. Single session general admission tickets will be available at the gate on game day for \$10 each and are available through the KHSAA website at www.khsaa.org/football.

Admission gates will open one hour before game time for each contest on Friday and Saturday.

STATE FOOTBALL PARKING

There is ample parking on site and within walking distance of Houchens-L.T. Smith Stadium. In addition to two parking structures, parking is available in the Creason Lot for \$5 per car. Additional parking is available at the Adams Street, Kentucky Street and Center Street lots for free with shuttle service to the stadium. On Friday and Saturday, lots will open at 8 a.m.

KHSAA MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials may be picked up at Entry Gate 3/4 at Houchens/L.T. Smith Stadium. The entry gate is on the "closed" end of the facility, and on the "Diddle Arena" side of the Stadium. An area map is posted on the Association website at www.khsaa.org.
